The power of His resurrection—Philippians 3:10

How hard it is to suffer. This is not meant to be trite or cliché. How hard it is! What would we sacrifice or give up in order to avoid suffering? I think many of us would quickly let go of many things that we would otherwise hold close and treasure.

The apostle Paul takes a different approach, which he writes about in Philippians 3. Yes, he gladly sacrifices what to him was precious and important. He gladly changes his life completely, but not to avoid suffering. Rather, he embraces suffering, not with the simple purpose to suffer, but suffering for a glorious hope.

¹⁰ I do this so that I may know him [Jesus] and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of his sufferings, being conformed to his death, ¹¹ in the hope that in some way I may arrive at the resurrection from the dead.

We just pondered Jesus' sufferings on Good Friday. Who would dare to know the fellowship of his sufferings? Who would willingly be conformed to his death?

We Christians do. **Do not dare to turn away now.** For you have seen not only the depth of suffering in Jesus and the agony of his death, but you have also paused by his empty tomb and seen it is empty. You have seen *the power of his resurrection*, and your hope is that you *may arrive at the resurrection from the dead*, to be like Jesus now, alive and glorious.

Do not turn away, not from Jesus, not from resurrection and also not from suffering. Rather turn away from everything that stands between you and suffering, between you and resurrection, between you and Jesus! Does this sound like something you would do?!?

That is the power of Jesus' resurrection: to change Paul and us, so that we believe and do what is not natural for us. Rather, we willingly take on suffering in hope and confidence because of Jesus. Think it is too hard? Then look again at Jesus' cross and tomb. Linger a while there. Jesus suffered for you, died for you and was resurrected for you. Thank Jesus like Paul did, not by turning away, but by leaning into Jesus even more, into his sufferings, and into the hope of resurrection in Jesus.

WARMING HEARTS AND SOULS UPDATE — It was miscalculated that this summer would end our campaign. Pastors are apparently not good at counting. This summer would end our second year of the campaign. So our time goal is not complete. We still would like to encourage everyone one of our members to keep giving over the next year. What we did reach was our monetary goal. We pledged to give \$160,000 over a three year period and as of this printing we have received \$171,171! Again this was to cover the expense of our heating system which was \$600,000.

<u>TEACHERS FOR NEXT YEAR</u> — Thank you for praying for our school and congregation as we continue calling for teachers. We trust that Jesus, who gives teachers (Ephesians 4:11), will send us his servants for next year.
